

## Snuggle Puddle




1 Draw two tilted ovals, slightly touching.




2 Connect two blobby shapes for the bodies, overlapping one another.




3 Start with the paw and tail of the cat on the right.



4 Now for the cat on the left, make sure the tails are forming a heart shape!



5 Add the ears and cheeks, as well as two happy faces.



6 Outline time! Take your time cleaning this sketch, paying attention to the overlaps.



7 Color one cat at a time. Opposite fur colors will look the best here. So, I started with a black cat (remember, it's really dark gray).




8 Color the last cat. For this one, I chose white with tan accents. Now you're all done!





1 Draw an upright oval with the center lines crossing in the center.



2 Connect a soft curvy shape for the body, slightly thicker at the bottom.



3 The front paws are bent. Draw them like this.



4 The hind paws are bent too! Start with ovals for the toes, then go on to draw the heels.



5 Time for a tail, face, and ears!




6 Add some fluff to the thighs and shoulders. Don't forget the chubby cheeks!





7 Great job! Let's clean up the sketch.



8 This cat is a British Shorthair! Warm grays will look best for the colors.











2 Draw a rounded rectangle shape just below, almost up to the middle of the oval.



3 Time to add the ears!



4 Now, draw two symmetrical curves on each side of the head.



5 Great! Now, add a squishy face and ear floof.



6 Go ahead and add the rest of the fluff, as well as a happy face using the cross guidelines.



7 Erase anything you don't want to see and polish the outline!



8 Let's color our cat! My cat is nice and chocolatey.
